

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY: On May 5, 2000, five days after the canonization of St. Faustina, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would be known as Divine Mercy Sunday. Jesus appeared to St. Faustina in a vision, with his right hand raised in blessing and his left touching his garment above his heart. Red and white rays emanate from his heart, symbolizing the blood and water that was poured out for our salvation. The Lord requested that "Jesus, I trust in You" be inscribed under his image. Jesus asked that His image be painted and venerated throughout the world: "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish" and "By means of this image I will grant many graces to souls." *US Conf. of Catholic Bishops, Washington DC*
